CONTEXT

Research is an integral and vital component of any form of education but in particular Higher Education. In the fields of Humanities and Applied Science in particular, Research is important in understanding the application of scientific research in applied settings and its utility. As a matter of principle, there is general consensus that any research involving human participants should be reviewed and considered by an appropriately constituted research ethics committee, which has the necessary competence to advise upon and make recommendations in relation to research involving humans. Such consideration should be undertaken in advance of the commencement of any research of this nature. Consideration may be by full review or in some instances may be expedited and undertaken by way of Chair's action or the action of a dedicated subcommittee. The Irish National Council on Bioethics (2004: 8-9) sets out the type of research activities that normally require review by a HREC.

POLICY STATEMENT

The Human Research Ethics Committee oversees the approval and monitoring of any Human Research undertaken in the College. It has to ensure that a participant's inclusion in a research study complies with principles set out by the Irish National Council on Bioethics (2004). Broadly speaking the HREC pays particular attention to and as far as practicable to ensure that research proposals/protocols presented to it for review will demonstrate evidence of how the research will adhere to the principles of/ and ensure:

- 1. Justice
- 2. beneficence
- 3. respect
- 4. risk and benefit analysis
- 5. participant's informed consent.
